ASSEMBLIES; COOKING; ART

This semester, we had 3 guest speakers presenting at our assemblies. Glen Brodowsky was very educational and enlightening to many students on why it is important to learn Chinese. He told us about his experience being Caucasian learning Chinese in both the personal and professional world.

Yan Tuo Shi of the Shaolin Temple of San Diego was educational and entertaining explaining the art of Shaolin Kung Fu, the Shaolin temple and his experiences as a child in the temple. His students demonstrated various forms and weapons which intrigued and captivated the attention of the students, teachers, parents and staff.

Dr. See Tsang Lac presented Chinese medicine including herbal treatments, acupuncture and cupping. Volunteers were used for acupuncture and cupping demonstrations.



The cooking classes have always been a popular extracurricular activity at the school as students of all ages participate in cooking various Chinese dishes ranging from tea cookies to Dim Sum. Along with learning how to cook Chinese dishes they are educated on the culture and how it pertains to the dish itself including manners and etiquette.
