Chinese School Overseas Fieldtrip

March 22 -31 - The Chinese School of San Diego hosted a 10 day

extraordinary field trip to Guangzhou, China; Cambodia and Hanoi. There were a total of 30 tourists including 4 students and 4 staff members.

We arrived in Guangzhou and toured the city eating Canton Dim Sum at a popular restaurant Lian Xiang Lou. We then visited the Chen Clan Academy and later the Sun Yat-Sen Memorial Hall and Pearl River.

After departing Guangzhou, we arrived in Siem Reap, Cambodia and toured several temples and landmarks. Notably, the Preah Ko,; Bakong; Lolei

temples; Angkor Thom; Bayon, Baphuon, and the Phimeanakas temples.

We got to ride in tuk tuk's visiting Ta Prohm which is one of Angkor's most memorable temples. We then explored Angkor Wat temple, which is the 7th Wonder of the Ancient World.

From Siem Reap we arrived in Hanoi and visited the Bai Dinh Pagoda and the Sang, Toi, Ba Giot caves; Nau Ruou; and spent the night on the Ha Long Bay aboard the 'Victory Star', a junk boat where we traveled past the limestone islands which rise above the water like waves while visiting the Vung Vieng fishing village in row boats with the rowers wearing traditional costumes. Some of us even had the opportunity to swim at the private beach.

We also had the pleasure of watching a popular water puppet show and shopping at a large wholesale mall.

Another highlight was visiting the Island of Kong, where the movie Kong was created as well as the set of Tomb Raider.
