On October 30<sup>th</sup>, our parents from Chinese School, Karen and Sonal, went with us to Vista Hills for a short visit to explore their programs and contribution to San Diego education for the mental disability individuals. We went to three different locations guided by Executive Director Rachel and Donor Relations Associate Brenda. Their programs range from early intervention and preventive work with children before they develop mental health issues, to youth immersed in substance use disorder to long-term special education and training for young people and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. After the visit, we plan to discuss our future food & toys drives as well as clothing drive specifically for Vista Hills.
